

## Notes from the board

#### October board meeting

On October 13th the monthly Beverly Heights Community League board meeting was held respecting current COVID-19 safety guidelines. Highlights include:

- ◆ The Beverly Heights hall and family centre will remain closed to rentals, programs and community events until stage 3 of the Alberta.ca Relaunch Strategy is reached.
- The decision about opening the rink will be made at the November board meeting. EFCL and the Government of Alberta are working on guidance documents for safe outdoor rink reopening the board will need to consider before making the decision.
- ◆ The Variety Show has not yet decided if the show will run for the 2021 season.
- ♦ A former board member has been working with residents to provide interim/emergency food hampers. A proposal for a LoveGood Food Box is being considered—it is like a little free library but with a few food items. The Food Box would be cleaned and stocked daily and donations would be accepted.
- ◆ The board welcomed the new Playground Liaison who will be a member on the Rundle Heights Playground Redevelopment Committee. A few more committee members are needed—see page 3 for details
- Our casino slotting has been delayed until the groups cancelled due to COVID-19 have been rescheduled. It is possible we will get a last-minute notice of an opening so may need volunteers!

 The Social Media rules have been updated for the Facebook page. Be sure to review.
 The Community Newspaper will be out at the end of November - watch your mailbox for your copy.

The next meeting will be Tuesday November 10 at 6:30pm. Community league members are welcome to attend the monthly meetings. Attendees are required to wear a mask and adhere to social distancing protocols.

#### **Neighbourhood Watch:**

The Car Curfew Program is a free and voluntary program. By placing a sticker on your vehicle's rear window (lower driver's side) your vehicle may be stopped by police to verify that it is not stolen if driven between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m. To find out more go to

You can prevent vehicle theft:

- 1. Do not leave your vehicle running with the key in the ignition.
- 2. Never leave spare keys hidden in a vehicle.
- 3. Lock up your vehicles and close your windows.
- 4. Use a steering wheel lock device.
- 5. Park in a well lit area.
