

### Notes from the BHCL board

### **May Board Meeting**

On Tuesday May 11, 2021 the Beverly Heights Community League Annual the monthly Beverly Heights Community League board meeting was held virtually. Highlights include:

- ◆ The Tri-Partite agreement between the league, EFCL and the City of Edmonton is being reviewed and changes will open up some rental options. Once implemented, we will be able to rent to for-profit organizations providing recreation, such as fitness instructors who will coordinate their own registration rather than the league having to coordinate.
- Summer Green Shack has been approved with services offered July 5 to August 27.
   Programming at t Floden Park is M-F 10:30 -1:30 and at Rundle Heights Playground is M-F 10:30-5:30.
- Goldbar Alliance was successful in ensuring the city has oversight over projects to run new wastewater routes to treatment. Hopefully that means it will be going to the Alberta Capital Region Wastewater rather than expansion at Goldbar.
- The Rundle Heights Playground Redevelopment Committee plan and budget was approved by the board. Much more fundraising is needed - please support our efforts!
- The Hall Reopening Committee will meet in June 1. With the hall being closed since March 2020 there are a lot of items on the to-do list but we are making progress in planning. Details about reopening will be shared as soon as dates are determined.
- Rink Clean up: The Britz and Ewanchuk families removed the old signage, the

- Burgardt family cleaned the batting cage, and the Hirtle family raked the dead grass from the inner fence line. Thank you!
- Mural the board discussed investigating options to add a mural to the outer walls of the hall to celebrate the history of the league and the variety show. Committee members will be needed!

Two positions were still available after the April AGM but have been filled! Welcome Beni Hopfe, the new Secretary and Jamie Boyce, the new Rink Director to the board.

## Pop-Up Community Garden - City of Edmonton

### Apply now for garden space!

The City of Edmonton is again offering temporary community gardens to grow edible plants in selected communities.

The Beverly / Rundle Pop Up Community Garden has been approved, with 15 planter boxes available. Applications for garden spaces has been extended to June 7th!

Gardens will be assigned to applicants based on City of Edmonton guidelines with priority given to those who are experiencing greater food insecurity impacts from COVID-19 as well as those who identify as Black, Indigenous, or persons of colour.

Gardeners will provide their own plants, seeds, and tools and tend the garden through the growing season. Gardeners are expected to follow the health requirements, maintaining social distance and sanitizing any shared objects after use. Seed donations may be available, and mentorship from experienced gardeners can be arranged.

We've seen the recent posts about bike thefts, garage break ins and other theft and vandalism. Please ensure your property is locked up, register your bike, and report crime or suspicious behavior. Thank you for pulling together as a community.

### Register your bike

Have you registered your bike yet? Register your bike on <a href="http://bikeindex.org">http://bikeindex.org</a> so others can identify it in the case it goes missing.

If you find a bike, find the serial number and search the registry to see if you can connect with the owner.

### Report Crime:

Remember if you see something suspicious report it by calling 780-423-4567, #377, or on the EPS Mobile App. If you see a crime in progress, call 911 and do not engage. It is better to be a good witness than an injured victim.

Victims and witnesses of any crime should be reporting.

Walking you block helps narrow the timeframe for crime and reduces vandalism. Reach out to your neighbours to start a walk your block group, or those that jog, walk their dog, or take daily strolls can register their walks as well.

## Rundle Heights Park Redevelopment Project

# Concept Phase, moving into Design Phase:

The 3 committee boards; BHCL, Ivor Dent and St Jerome; have approved and signed off on the concept plan and the budget of approximately \$790,530. We are very excited to be moving into the next design phase soon.

What this means for the committee and the community: we will continue to fundraise and apply for grants to pay for the project. So far we have approximately \$532, 540 raised between City of Edmonton NPDP grant, Ivor Dent's provincial grant as a new/replacement school, donations from both schools casino accounts and fundraising money.

More community engagement is also in the works, to share the project with community members and to gain feedback around the look of the park, equipment etc. Remember to tag us in your park photos #Rundleplays, so we

can get some ideas. We will continue to share updates on our Facebook page, through the community e-newsletter and on the BHCL website.

### Thank you for your support:

## City of Edmonton notes for our area

### **Garbage & Food Scrap Carts**

The first garbage day with the new garbage and food scrap cart is Friday June 4th!

Download the Edmonton WasteWise app for pick-up reminders and help sorting trash, recycling and food scraps. Here are some things to note:

- Review the information package that arrived with your carts. If you still have questions, click <a href="here">here</a>. Education sessions are offered.
- If your pick up was in the back before, it is in the back now. Ensure your bins are 1m apart and 1m from any structure. Recycling bags should be 1m away from bins.
- For homes with large families, a larger garbage cart is available,
- The City offers free disposal at Eco Stations for occasional excess garbage - up to 2 clear bags - and yard waste. If your garbage is not in clear bags or includes food waste or recyclables there will be a \$9 fee.
- Garbage carts will be collected every <u>two</u> weeks. Lids must close completely. No extra bags will be picked up.
- The food scraps cart is collected weekly from spring to fall, and every two weeks in winter. Yard waste and grass clippings can be added to your bin if there is space.
- Recycling is collected weekly use the usual blue bags.
- Yard waste will be picked up seasonally, with two collections in the spring and two in the

### **Big Bin Events**

The City of Edmonton is hosting Big Bin events for household items that can't be set out for regular waste collection. Ten weekend events will be held in various locations throughout the City. www.edmonton.ca/bigbinevents

Edmonton residents will be able to drop off items such as old couches, chairs, mattresses, and appliances free of charge. Computers and other electronics will also be accepted for recycling. Do \*NOT\* bring household hazardous waste like paint, varnish, household cleaners or batteries. Take those items to an Eco Station.

All events will run from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm.

# Residential Street Speed Limit Reduction to 40 km/hr in August

From the City of Edmonton website: "Starting this August, the city-wide default speed limit will be 40 km/h. If you don't see a speed limit sign on a residential road, the speed limit will be 40 km/h."

"All roads indicated with the new 40 km/h speed limit are expected to take effect this August. The implementation date will be announced in July, one month before this new speed limit is in effect, alongside a public education campaign."

30 km/h playground zones will still be in effect from 7:30am to 9pm.

### **Road Closure**

Our Neighbourhood Resource Coordinator, Anna, shared: "The bridge on Ada Boulevard over Gretzky Drive is scheduled for renewal this year. It will be closed starting April 2021 to vehicles, cyclists and pedestrians. A detour to 112 Avenue is suggested." ### Yellowhead Trail East Widening

During the engagement sessions held in 2019, concerns were raised about safe merging operations at eastbound Yellowhead Trail from Victoria Trail. Bryon Heroux, Project Manager with the City of Edmonton reports "Building on this slightly, the changes we are making to Yellowhead Trail (mainly adding an additional through lane) means that there is no longer capacity to support a dedicated freeflow lane from the NB Victoria Trail to EB Yellowhead Trail on-ramp as the Beverly Bridge is only three lanes across. Additionally, maintaining the two merge locations (NB and SB Victoria Trail to EB YHT) with three through lanes on Yellowhead Trail would mean that the length of merge lanes would not be sufficient."

To access Yellowhead Eastbound, rather than heading east on 118 Ave and taking the current ramp there will be a new ramp con-

structed near the Victoria Trail bridge. You will turn left onto the turn ramp to head east. This construction will be completed before the current ramp is closed, and this will be completed by the fall of 2021.


