Board Meeting

The Beverly Heights Community League board met in person in August for the first time since March 2020! Updates include:

- We will continue this eNewsletter to keep you in the loop - be sure to get on the email list by buying a community league membership and adding your email address, or email volunteer.bhcl@gmail.com to be added.
- The new Tripartite agreement has been ratified and comes into effect Jan 2022. This opens up rentals to for-profit individuals and groups (i.e. fitness instructors) to rent the hall to provide their programs as long as there is a community benefit. We look forward to this!
- The hall and family centre are again available for rentals as of July 15. Extensive cleaning is planned with full sanitization between events.
- The playground near No Frills is in poor condition and needs attention. A committee has started to look at ideas, options and funding. Members are needed! Next meeting is Friday September 17 at 10am. Email volunteer.bhcl@gmail.com.
- The casino is complete and fund should arrive in November.
- The City of Edmonton has delayed the start of the Free Community League swim. Our community league members get free access to Commonwealth Rec Centre pool on Sundays from 1-3pm compliments of your league. Present your community league membership for free access. Rundle Heights Park Redevelopment Project

Concept and Budget

At our Sep 1st committee meeting the City of Edmonton presented an official Concept drawing, with measurements and official details. With the updated Concept plan, can a clearer picture of the budget (previously the estimate was +/- 50%). The new budget is \$804,016.67 (+/- 30%). We're still working through the final concept steps and approvals, as we were waiting for that final drawing form the City before we could move forward. 

your mailbox for the past several years. In the last edition there was some information on page 2 we want to clarify.

The Beverly Heights board <u>did not</u> withdraw support for the paper. Our representative attended a meeting to discuss the benefits of the paper to the community, the challenges with the frequency, timelines, timing, distribution, etc, and to gather information about the future plans for the paper to bring back to the board to discuss options. At the meeting, because another partner had decided to withdraw, the coordinator declared that the paper could not continue without all partners and it would cease to operate after this fall edition. Our board did not get the opportunity to discuss and vote on continuing financial support of the paper, nor were we informed that options to continue the newspaper were being considered, but we look forward to seeing the response to the poll about if the readers would like the paper to continue or would like to have other ways to get information. We care about keeping our members informed with relevant, timely information and will strive to do this to the best of our abilities.

The City of Edmonton has redrawn its ward boundaries with 12 new Indigenous ward names that take effect as of the election on October 18, 2021. These names were gifted to the city by *iyiniw iskwewak wihtwawin*, an all-female, Indigenous ward naming committee.

The Indigenous ward names are a small but important first step in reconciliation and in understanding the history and stories of the many Indigenous nations that were the first residents of Canada.


